## About this Seminar:

In this seminar, Prof Lucy Reed reprises her 2012 Kaplan Lecture exploring the "softer" aspects of arbitrator decision-making, as relevant to counsel decision-making on case strategy.

The first part of the seminar will describe research on the process of decision-making in arbitration, which borrows from studies of judicial decision-making. This involves the balance between intuition and deduction, and the positive and negative impact on decision-making of "heuristics" – the mental shortcuts we all take, for example the "anchoring effect" – and resulting cognitive biases.

The second part will focus on how counsel can use this research in strategizing how to present their clients' cases more effectively in arbitration.

While with the US State Department's Office of the Legal Adviser, she was the US Agent to the Iran-US Claims Tribunal. Lucy speaks and writes regularly on international arbitration topics, and one of her most-cited articles remains *Practical* 

Guidelines for Interviewing, Selecting and Challenging Party-Appointed Arbitrators in International Commercial Arbitration (with Doak Bishop, 14 Arb. Int'l (1998)).
