Chan Leng Sun SC Advocate, Essex Court Chambers Duxton (Singapore Group Practice)

Leng Sun is a Senior Counsel of the Supreme Court of Singapore. He is the Deputy Chairman of the Singapore International Arbitration Centre and the SGX Appeals Committee. He is a member of the ICC Commission on Arbitration and ADR and the Advisory Panel of the Singapore Maritime Foundation. Leng Sun is qualified in Malaysia, Singapore and England. He has a broad commercial practice that covers technical disputes, maritime law, international trade, insurance and company law. Leng Sun is a Chartered Arbitrator, the Immediate Past President of the Singapore Institute of Arbitrators (SIArb) and the former Global Head of Arbitration of an international law firm. He has acted as counsel or sat as arbitrator in arbitrations seated in Asia, Europe and USA under ad hoc and institutional rules. He is a Chairperson of the arbitration panel jointly appointed by the EU and Korea under the protocol on cultural cooperation of the Korea-EU FTA. Leng Sun is a Singapore delegate to the UNCITRAL Working Group on Arbitration and was a legal officer of the United Nations Compensation Commission in Geneva. Leng Sun is recognised among the top lawyers worldwide by "Legal 500 Asia Pacific 2019", "Who's Who Legal - Arbitration 2017", "Who's Who Litigation - Thought Leaders 2019" and Acritas Stars 2019. He is described by Chambers Asia-Pacific 2017 as "one of the best arbitrators and practitioners in arbitration.



Ben GiarettaPartner, Dispute Resolution, Mishcon de Reya LLP, London

Ben Giaretta is a partner of Mishcon de Reya LLP, specialising in international arbitration. Formerly a partner of Ashurst LLP in Singapore, he relocated to London in 2016, and in 2017 he joined Mishcon de Reya, one of the leading independent firms in London. He is a Fellow of the SIArb, a Fellow of the CIArb and a Chartered Arbitrator. His experience spans a number of different sectors, including oil & gas, mining, petrochemicals and construction. He appears as counsel in arbitration and often sits as arbitrator, being on the panels of arbitrators of several institutions.



Sarah Grimmer Secretary-General, Hong Kong International Arbitration Centre

Sarah Grimmer is Secretary-General of Hong Kong International Arbitration Centre. She was formerly Senior Legal Counsel at the PCA where she served as tribunal secretary in multiple investor-State arbitrations and was appointed registrar in several inter-State arbitrations. Prior to joining the PCA, Sarah served for three years as Assistant Counsel at the ICC International Court of Arbitration in Paris. She was also a member of the international arbitration group at Shearman & Sterling LLP in Paris, prior to which she worked in private practice in Auckland. In 2015, Sarah was appointed to the Special Tribunal for Lebanon Disciplinary Board. She is a member of the ICCA-ASIL Task Force on Damages (2016), ICCA Publications Committee (2015), the IBA Investment Arbitration Subcommittee (2014), New Zealand ICC Arbitration Committee (2013). She has an LLM from Cambridge University and an LLB/BA (Criminology) from Victoria University of Wellington. She is admitted to practice law in New Zealand.



Siraj Omar SCDirector, Dispute Resolution, Drew & Napier LLC, Singapore

Siraj specialises in complex, high-value commercial litigation and international arbitration. He has an active trial and appellate practice at all levels of the Courts in Singapore, and also regularly appears in international arbitrations both as counsel and arbitrator. He has litigated many landmark disputes before the Courts, including in areas as diverse as banking, consumer protection and debt restructuring. Siraj began his career at Drew & Napier in 1997 before leaving in 2002 to join the corporate practice of an international law firm.

In 2008, he co-founded Premier Law and headed its Dispute Resolution practice. In 2016, Premier Law entered into a joint venture with the UK law firm RPC, and Siraj was concurrently a Partner and Head of Dispute Resolution at the joint venture firm, RPC Premier Law. He rejoined Drew & Napier as a Director in 2019.
